## Notes to the interim financial report – 31 March 2015 A1 Basis of preparation

The interim financial statements are unaudited and have been prepared in compliance with Malaysian Financial Reporting Standard (MFRS) 134 and International Accounting Standards (IAS) 34: Interim Financial Reporting and paragraph 9.22 and Appendix 9B of the Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad.

The interim financial statements are to be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2014. The explanatory notes attached to the interim financial statements provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the financial year ended 31 December 2014.

## B1 Detailed analysis of the performance of all operating segment of the Group

The Group recorded a revenue of RM59.008 million and profit before tax of RM0.524 million for the 3 months ended 31 March 2015 as compared to revenue of RM62.762 million and profit before tax of RM2.503 million for the preceding year corresponding period.

Performance of the respective operating business segments for the 3 months ended 31 March 2015 as compared to the preceding year corresponding period are analysed as follows:-

### Trading and services

Despite an increased in the revenue, the profit before tax was decreased due to increase in supply of certain products with a lower profit margin.

#### Property development

No revenue was recognised during the quarter and loss before tax was mainly due to administrative cost incurred.

#### Construction

The decrease in the revenue and loss before tax compared to the preceding year corresponding period was mainly due to lesser construction activities during the period.

#### <u>Investment property</u>

The increase in revenue was due to additional rental income from a few new tenancies for certain investment property.

### B2 Comparison with preceding quarter results

For the quarter under review, the Group recorded a profit before taxation of RM0.524 million on a revenue of RM59.008 million as compared to a profit before taxation of RM28.090 million on a revenue of RM152.807 million for the preceding quarter. The decrease in revenue and profit before tax were mainly due to decrease in sales volume for trading & services and property development division.

### **B3** Prospects

The outlook for the construction and property development industry on which the Group business substantially relies on, remains competitive and challenging. Nevertheless, the Group will continue to look for new business opportunities and will continue to tender for new potential projects in order to maintain satisfactory results.
